proper names: these are alphabetized according to their English translation (quite makeshift in many cases) in four major sections: mythological characters (and cf. under "mythological animals" as well), men's proper names, women's proper names, and animals' proper names.

proper names—mythological characters:

These are divided on the basis of their occurrence in the accompanying Texts into major characters, subsidiary characters, and minor characters. Many more common nouns also occur as the names of myth beings (e.g., such important figures as /ča·qya·k/ "Little Boy"), but they are not found in any of the author's texts and so are not included here. A few names which do not occur in the Texts but which have no common noun meaning (i.e., function only as "proper names") are added here. Text references follow each entry wherever possible. It should be noted that the present division into major, subsidiary, and minor characters is based solely upon the occurrence of these figures in the author's texts; in the totality of Klamath mythology the status of many of these beings would almost certainly have to be changed.
