The following forms are from the East African language Swahili.

1.	ninasoma	'I am reading'
2.	unasoma	'You are reading'
3.	anasoma	'He is reading'
4.	tunasoma	'We are reading'
5.	mnasoma	'You (pl.) are reading'
6.	wanasoma	'They are reading'
7.	ninapanda	'I am going up'
8.	anapanda	'He is going up'
9.	alipanda	'He went up'
10.	nilipanda	'I went up'
11.	nilisoma	'I read (past)'
12.	nitasoma	'I will read'
13.	nimesoma	'I have read'
14.	tumesoma	'We have read'
15.	anafundisha	'He is teaching'
16.	ananifundisha	'He is teaching me'
17.	anatufundisha	'He is teaching us'
18.	mmesoma	'You (pl.) have read'
19.	nimewatazama	'I have looked at them'
